REACH 6 Meeting Recap

There were 20 people in attendance at the June 26 REACH 6 meeting, including Mary Poole from the City of Citrus Heights.

Bill Chavez, District Project Manager, gave a general overview of the project. He explained the construction methods and timeline, as well as the fact that the project is broken up into three sections (Upper Northwest Interceptor 9 and Associated Northeast Area 1 & 2 Relief Projects, NEA-1 & NEA-2). He explained the project routes and major streets included for each route.

Chavez also clarified that there are two different size pipes –24-inch pipes and 36-inch pipes – on this project.

Chavez said that the majority of the project construction will use the tunneling method to minimize possible impacts to the public.

Question: This project involves tunneling?

Answer: Yes. The majority of this project will use the tunneling method.

Mike Garcia highlighted the public outreach efforts, which include maintaining a project Web site, distribution of door hangers announcing construction work, fact sheets, magnets with the project hotline number, Web site and map on them. He also mentioned that attendees could sign up to be on the project mailing list and receive quick commuter updates. A mailing list sign-up sheet was then passed around.
